Entry Requirements

Requirements vary by university and programme.

| Bachelor's and long-cycle programmes

Applicants normally need:

- ✓ Recognised secondary-school certificate
- ✓ Academic transcripts
- ✓ Valid passport
- ✓ Proof of English or Czech proficiency
- ✓ Completed online application
- ✓ Application-fee payment
- ✓ Motivation letter or references, if required
- ✓ Entrance examination, interview or portfolio for certain courses

| Master's programmes

Applicants normally need:

- ✓ Relevant bachelor's degree
- ✓ Academic transcript
- ✓ Recognition of the previous qualification
- ✓ Proof of language proficiency
- ✓ CV and motivation letter
- ✓ References, portfolio or entrance examination where applicable

Medicine, Dentistry and selected science programmes generally require relevant secondary-school subjects and may include examinations in Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Mathematics.

Applications are submitted directly to individual universities. Deadlines commonly fall between February and April for autumn entry, but every faculty sets its own dates and requirements.

LANGUAGE

Language Requirement

Programmes are taught in Czech or English, and applicants must show proficiency in the language of instruction. Each university sets its own accepted certificates and levels.

Student Visa Process

EU, EEA and Swiss citizens do not require a student visa, although registration requirements may apply for longer stays.

Students from outside the EU normally require either:

- ✓ A long-stay visa for studies; or
- ✓ A long-term residence permit for study purposes

Common supporting documents include:

- ✓ Valid passport
- ✓ University admission confirmation
- ✓ Proof of accommodation
- ✓ Evidence of sufficient funds
- ✓ Comprehensive health insurance
- ✓ Passport photographs
- ✓ Criminal-record certificate, if requested
- ✓ Educational documents
- ✓ Czech translations and legalisation of foreign documents

Visa and residence applications are generally submitted through the appropriate Czech embassy. Official guidance indicates that processing can take up to 60 days, so early application is strongly recommended.
